Last month's main presentation: Hamid Mirfenderesk – 'A story about Physics'



Well, talking about a presentation with a difference... Hamid opened up asking "What are you doing for fun?", explaining that, as different writers write about different things, relationships and life experiences, Physics addresses the same thing.

"Physics can answer the age-old question: Why are we here?",
Hamid stated. [I recall that I often thought the same
thing when I was sitting in a High School Math
class... Ed. [I]. Hamid took us through a fascinating journey,
starting with a quote by famous Danish Physicist Niels Bohr: "We
must be clear that when it comes to atoms, language can be used
only in poetry. The poet, too, is not nearly so concerned with
describing facts as with creating images and establishing mental
connection." Well, why didn't my Maths teacher come up with

that one! Ultimately, everything, be that a human, a table or a jug of water, can be broken down from to Electrons, Protons and Neutrons, Hamid explained.

His presentation continued on Einstein's Theory of Relativity, Werner Heisenberg, the evolution of the world as we know it from 4.5 Billion years ago to today (Homo Sapiens only started about 300,000 years ago, or 6.7% of the total time). And then he concluded with one of the most profound writers this earth has seen, the Persian Poet <u>Saadi</u>

What a feast! That was a completely different concept about writing than we had ever heard before! Thank you, Hamid.
