Last month's guest speaker: Rhiannon Elton



In marketing, a major factor is "your point of difference". So, Rhiannon Elton doesn't describe herself just as an author of children's stories. On Her website she describes herself as a "Fantasy Detective Author". Yes, Rhiannon certainly would know: Her set of 'Wolflock Cases – Volume 1' alone has 10 books in it!

So, how does one become a successful author? "I grew up as a child who loved writing," she said. "Every single day I would write into my book. I loved

dinosaurs." Then write, rewrite... All my high school years, writing was my refuge from bullying. Then I got to Years 11/12..." And still today: "You must write every day." She calls it her 'Morning Pages'. "It's like turning on a tap. Do NOT analyse it!"

Where many authors speak almost exclusively about their books (yes, of course!), Rhiannon extended this to immensely educational marketing tuition. She names her technique her 'Wizard Tower'. "You have your own version of magic" she enthused. "Your wizard tower does not have to be a standard tower. It can be a gothic cathedral or a penthouse. Grahame Moore's, writing rural stories, would be a big homestead with a wide verandah."

Rhiannon also extensively elaborated on the secrets of a good website and social media presence. "Each one of these is a brick in your tower: she elaborated. "Chose 5 colours that look good and match what your colours are as an author. E.g. in my case, black letter (it's

actually dark green) background, dark words and silver. Suit, shirt and jacket will always match. The colour will talk about you as an author..."

Sorry people, I need to stop right here; you should have been there yourself! We ended up going over time, and I assure you: nobody complained.
